- 1. You are hereby invited to submit technical proposals for consultancy services required under: Conducting Feasibility Study for the NILALEG Project Encroacher Bush Biomass Charcoal Piloting Plant, which could form the basis for future negotiations and ultimately, a contract between you and the EIF: NILALEG Project.
- 2. This Request for Proposal (RFP) has been issued under the method of Open national bidding for Namibian consultancy firms.

## 3. Aim of Consultancy

The Environmental Investment Fund invests in and support projects and activities, which promote the national development strategy of the Government of the Republic of Namibia (GRN). The entity works with different stakeholders including donor communities to Implement Project Activities On the Ground. The consultant is expected to provide consultancy services to Conducting Feasibility Study for the NILALEG Project Encroacher Bush Biomass Charcoal Piloting Plant

## 10. Deciding Award of Contract

Qualification and experience of the consultants shall be considered as the paramount requirement. The proposals will be evaluated on the basis of a maximum of 70 marks for Technical Proposals and 30 marks for Financial proposals. Proposals from consultants should score at least 70 marks for the Technical Proposals to be retained for further consideration.

Only those consultants scoring a total of 70 marks on the overall assessment shall be considered for the assignment. Negotiations will start with the Consultant scoring the highest marks and if negotiation is not successful, negotiation will start with the next best ranked Consultant and so on until an agreement is reached. Should you be contacted for negotiations, you must be prepared to furnish the detailed cost break-down and other clarifications to the proposals submitted by you, as may be required to adjudge the reasonableness of your price proposals.

#### Terms of Reference for the Feasibility Study

## "Encroacher Bush Biomass Charcoal Piloting Plant"

#### 1. Introduction

The Government of the Republic of Namibia, with support from the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Global Environment Facility, has embarked on a 6-year project, led by the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism (MEFT), to support regional councils, constituencies and communities to implement an integrated landscape management approach in key agricultural and forest landscapes, and to reduce poverty through sustainable nature-based livelihood strategies, that also promote the protection of biodiversity, restoration of forests as carbon sinks, and contribute to avoiding, reducing reversing land degradation.

The NILALEG Project has four components illustrated below, being implemented intertwinably by local based sectoral consortia and technical specialists at five landscapes and at national level.

Component 3 i.e. Sustainable financing for implementation and upscaling of the integrated landscape management approach is designed to achieve the outcome of enhanced access to finance, technical assistance and market information to pilot and scale-up the integrated landscape management approach and sustainable enterprises. This component is implemented under the auspices of Environmental Investment Fund of Namibia with technical support of project Technical Specialist #4: Finance and Enterprise Development, and Technical Specialist #3: Agroforestry, Rangeland Management and Restoration.

One of the component outputs is to scale-up a public works programme for landscape restoration, piloting sale of charcoal and by-products from bush control on encroach farms, with pilot area of 3,000 ha. National Youth Service (NYS) has highly bush encroached Gemsbokpan farm about 60km from Rietfontein Youth Centre in Otjozondjupa Region. The NYS aspire to venture in harvesting biomass, its

processing into charcoal as a way of cleaning the area for the best practice of crop and livestock production; and impact on national development and youth empowerment. It is equally envisaged to provide an opportunity for motivated and talented youth to "graduate" from the programme, and set up their own small businesses doing bush thinning and charcoaling on small scale commercial farm, with support to access loan finance for equipment.

#### 2. Rational of work

The main purpose of the current NILALEG bush encroachment de-bushing is to create conducive environment for the practice of agriculture mainly crop and livestock production for National Youth Service employment creation, training and poverty reduction. To this effect, NILALEG Project in support of the NYS under the auspices of Environmental Investment Fund of Namibia (EIF) is to initiate biomass harvesting, processing and production of charcoal, tar and biochar from cleared encroacher bush on its Gemsbokpan farm and surrounding commercial/resettlement farms.

Therefore, this Term of Reference seeks for a biomass business development consultant to conduct a feasibility study to confirm the proposed business viability; development of sustainable value chain for utilisation of encroach bush towards charcoal production, processing, packaging and marketing.

## 3. Objectives

The consultant is expected to provide specialised technical analysis and financial forecasts that will assist and guide NILALEG and its implementation consortia during planning, designing and establishment of proposed biomass production facilities. Hence, the objectives of the consultancy are:

- 3.1 to conduct feasibility study for establishment of a sustainable biomass production plant at the identified farms/sites of the NYS
- 3.2 validate and confirm assumptions/concept through a formalised business case containing detailed evaluation of costs, benefits, risks and opportunities (SWOT Analysis)
- 3.3 to present recommendations for strategic location, operational modalities, potential final products and biomass value chains vs the market, logistics, financial projections, infrastructural and management plan for the business
- 3.4 to recommend institutional set up, management and operational strategies
- 3.5 to propose a design of the NYS youth capacity building programs

#### 4. Specific tasks

The expected final deliverable is a **feasibility study report and business plan** include among others the:

- 4.1 assessment of proposed biomass venture for the NYS in relation to the following:
  - a. evaluation of biomass potential (density, length of biomass harvesting, charcoal production), market and profit; location and Namibia biomass industry in general;
  - b. Establishment of PPP between NYS and public/private sector to enable business investment, biomass processing, charcoal production and commercialization both local and internationally.
  - Assess biomass production concept and consider ideal location, plant design (sketch), to provide evidence of potential sustainability biomass harvesting, processing, packaging and marketing;

- d. Propose a management structure *in lieu* of apparent Joint Venture partnership with private operator for skills, benchmarking, quality assurance, market access and socioeconomic return evaluation:
- 4.2 analysis of business viability and implementation scenario of the proposed initiatives and determine the:
  - a. capital investment required,
  - b. market demand,
  - c. critical success factors,
  - d. capacity development support required,
  - e. environmental constraints,
  - f. operations arrangements appropriate to scale and complexity of the plant
  - g. political, economic, social, technological, environmental and legal (PESTEL) implications,
  - h. conceptual implementation plan and
  - i. access the existing infrastructure potential (road, water, electricity etc.), for the implementation of charcoal production initiative.
- 4.3 financial returns on sustainable operations to justify the investment over ten-years,
- 4.4 Public-Private-Partnership ratio in considerations of NILALEG underlying principles for initial investment and NYS empowerment programs,
- 4.5 interrogate developments of similar nature in the area or elsewhere and determine the relevance of the venture. Then, advise on the suitability of the location for the development taking into consideration:
  - a. Accessibility and visibility
  - b. Ecological sustainability/advantage
  - c. Socio-economic dynamics
  - d. Competition
  - e. Market access and segmentation to understand where to focus efforts and marketing activities as well as future market potential
- 4.6 harvesting plan and supply agreement with farmers determining economic impact to the recipient farmers.

#### 5. Geographical scope

The feasibility study is to be undertaken for a biomass charcoal production piloting project to be set up in the Otjozondjupa region of Namibia. The project identified sites include the NYS Rietfontein centre (1616.23 ha) lies 40 kilometres south of Grootfontein as a potential processing and packaging site and the NYS Gemsbokpan farm (7 222 ha) lies 60 kilometres south of Rietfontein as a potential harvesting and carbonization site.

#### 6. Deliverables

- Inception report having detailed study design and data collection tools
- Draft report (max. 30 pages), based on the objectives and tasks as mentioned above, to be submitted to the EIF before the meeting discussing the draft
- Final report (max. 30 pages), based on the objectives and tasks as mentioned above, no later than two weeks after reception of comments on the draft report
