“Building Resilience of Communities Living in Landscapes Threatened Under Climate Change Through an Ecosystems-Based Adaptation Approach”



Project Background

The Environmental Investment Fund of Namibia (EIF) is a State Owned Enterprise, established through the Environmental Investment Fund Act of 2001 with the main purpose of raising financial resources for direct investment in environmental protection and natural resource management activities and projects.

At the 22nd meeting of its Board on 28th February 2019, the Green Climate Fund approved funding for the project entitled “Building resilience of communities living in landscapes threatened under climate change through an ecosystem-based adaptation approach” (SAP006-EbA Project), with the EIF as the accredited entity for the project.

The SAP006-EbA Project is expected to build adaptation measures for more than 216,000 Namibians (60,000 direct beneficiaries and 156,000 indirect beneficiaries). The beneficiaries constitute 7.5% of Namibia’s total population. With its focus on gender responsive adaptation measures, 50% of the project’s beneficiaries are women.

Project Location

The SAP006-EbA Project is implemented in 13 of the 14 political regions of Namibia and is clustered into 8 landscapes:

- Southern Landscape
- Kunene South and Daures Landscape
- Kunene North Landscape
- Lower Eastern Landscape
- North Central Landscape
- Kavango East and West
- Zambezi East
- Zambezi West
- ✓ Ovitoto and Otjimbingwe

Project Objectives

To increase climate change resilience of productive landscapes in Namibia through implementation of ecosystems-based adaptation actions that strengthen social and ecological systems to sustain livelihoods at local level and facilitate value chains of natural resources.

Specific Objectives

- To **enhance the resilience** of natural resources and livelihoods sensitive to climate change impacts through improving community adaptive capacities to sustainably manage natural resources; and
- To **maintain and enhance ecosystem integrity** to continue to support the generation of food and income in order to reduce the severity of the negative socio-economic impacts of climate change on **vulnerable rural households**.

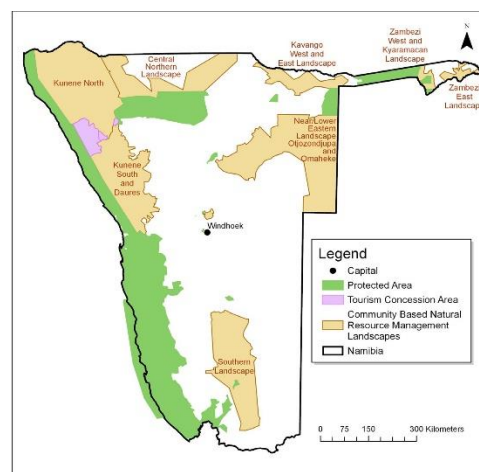
